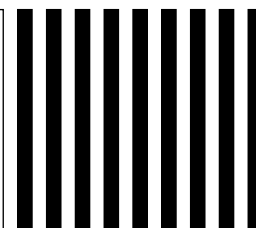

The Alicia Project

On New Year's Day 2002, Alicia Kozakiewicz, then 13 years old, disappeared from her suburban Pittsburgh home. Family and investigators had suspicions that the teen may have been lured by someone she had met in an Internet chat room. Acting on a tip from the predator's online acquaintance, authorities were able to track Alicia to a townhouse in Virginia, where they found her physically restrained. FBI agents arrested a 38-year-old computer programmer who is currently serving a sentence of almost 20 years.

Alicia, now 18 and a student at Point Park University in Pittsburgh, frequently speaks to youth groups about the dangers of meeting people on the Internet. Alicia's mother Mary, as a member of Team HOPE, reaches out to parents whose children are endangered or missing, and encourages other parents to be vigilant about monitoring their children's Internet usage and safety. Their family is currently participating in two Internet safety films, one for the FBI and the other for Pennsylvania schools, and they are also the subject of an upcoming PBS special and People magazine article about cyber crimes against children.
